Julia Wood History Essay Competition 2025

The Julia Wood prize is an annual History essay competition named in memory of a St Hugh's College historian.

The Principal and Fellows of St Hugh's College, Oxford offer a prize, worth up to £500, for the best historical essay written on a subject of your choice.

The competition is open to any student who, at the closing date, has been in the Sixth Form of any school or college for a period of not more than two years. The prize may be split between multiple winning entries.

The choice of historical subject is left to candidates.

- Entries should be 2000 4000 words in length, including any material in the footnotes which is additional commentary or content related to your essay.
- Essays should be fully referenced. You are welcome to use whichever style of referencing you prefer. References or citations in footnotes and in your bibliography are not included in the word count.
- · Essays must be submitted in PDF format.
- We are only able to accept essays written in English.

The closing date for entries is 2pm (BST) on Wednesday 23rd July.
Winners will be announced in August.

The Principal and Fellows of St Hugh's College are pleased to offer a prize of up to £500 for the best essay written in response to one of the following three set questions:

Politics

"We cannot understand support for the populist right without accounting for its economic determinants." Discuss.

Philosophy

If a scientist predicts, on the strength of a well attested theory, that some event will occur, while someone else has a strong premonition that some incompatible event will occur, why should we defer to the former rather than to the latter?

Economics

Can we address climate change at the same time as maintaining positive economic growth? Discuss.

Entry is restricted to pupils who, at the closing date, have been in the Sixth Form of any state-funded school or college for a period of not more than two years.

- Entries should be 2000 4000 words in length, including any material in the footnotes which is additional commentary or content related to your essay.
- Essays should be fully referenced. You are welcome to use whichever style of referencing you prefer. References or citations in footnotes and in your bibliography are not included in the word count.
- · Essays must be submitted in PDF format.

The closing date for entries is 2pm (BST) on Wednesday 23rd July. Winners will be announced in August.
