Please see below the key dates. The Oxbridge, Medics and Dentists cohort have a deadline in two weeks. All applications should be ready for Mrs Vaughan by 7th October so she can ensure references are completed and all is finalised before the official deadline. The remainder of UCAS applications should be completed before Christmas so final checks and references can be completed before the 25th January. Of course you do not need to wait until then!!!






