






From next week all Sixth Form students will need to use their ID card to access the Sixth Form building via the front doors.

10-13 considering a career in healthcare. We encourage students to register as

Health Education England's discovery report on virtual work experience programmes concluded that these programmes are a valuable adjunct to inperson work experience, especially in our current climate where in-person experiences remain extremely limited.

We kindly request you to forward this information to your students so that they can enrol on the programme in plenty of time before the UCAS deadline for NHS Health Careers in January.

This NHS Virtual Work Experience Programme is suitable for anyone considering:

- Nursing
- Midwifery
- Paramedicine
- Physiotherapy
- Occupational Therapy
 - Dietetics
 - Radiography
- Prosthetics and Orthotics
- Speech and Language Therapy
 - Pharmacy

Once registered, students will be emailed links to their virtual work experience portals.

All attendees are awarded a Work Experience Certificate for every session they complete. Those who complete the full 5-month programme will be awarded a Highly Commended Reference from the Presidents of Allied Healthcare Mentor.

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. They will gain a unique insight into how patients interact with a variety of healthcare professionals and what it's like to work in an NHS multidisciplinary team.

Attendees will have the opportunity to interact with healthcare professionals throughout each day, allowing them to make informed decisions about their future careers.

Students can register throughout the 5-month programme using the link below. We recommend booking early to gain as much out of this programme as possible. Places are £10 a session to cover administrative and technological costs.

To be eligible to apply, you must be a British Citizen. One of your parents must be a British Citizen or must have the nationality or citizenship from our approved list of countries (further information on our eligibility criteria can be found here). If you hold dual nationality, of which one component is British, you will nonetheless be considered. Candidates must normally have been resident in the UK for seven out of the last ten years. This is particularly important if you were born outside the UK. You can apply at the age of 17 years, if successful you will not be offered a start date prior to your 18th birthday.

What is a Nuffield Research Placement

When? – During summer holidays after Year 12 (England, Wales & Northern Ireland) or S5 (Scotland).

How long? – 4-6 weeks in total. This includes independent study ahead of 2-3 weeks for the real-world placement collaboration activities.

What? – A well-supervised but independent placement relating to an area of science, quantitative social science, computing, technology, engineering or maths - or a combination!

Cost? – You can take part in a placement at no cost. Travel costs are reimbursed and you may also be eligible to receive a £200 subsidy.

Where? – Placements take place in a variety of locations including offices, museums, research centres, laboratories or fieldwork settings.

We are letting you know about the exciting opportunity for current year 12 students, potentially interested in studying law at university, to attend the **Cambridge Sixth Form Law Conference**. This is a four-day residential trip to Cambridge University, which aims to give students an insight into the study of Law and life as an undergraduate at Cambridge. It is organised

and run by seven current Law undergraduates, many of whom attended the Law Conference themselves and are passionate about giving other students the opportunity to have this experience.

The conference will run between the 27th-30th March

During the residential aspect of the conference, delegates will attend Cambridge style lectures, have the chance to meet current students and explore the city and colleges of Cambridge. Delegates will stay in college undergraduate accommodation, under the supervision of the Committee and college Porters. This arrangement has proved to be both safe and satisfactory over the past four decades and also helps to offer an extra aspect of life at Cambridge. All meals are provided. Whilst under appropriate supervision, delegates are given the time and the freedom to explore the city on their own and live life as if they were an undergraduate student.

200 delegates will attend the Conference this year, with a combination of funded and non-funded places available. For non-funded students, the Conference will cost £155, which covers both accommodation and food, but not travel. Only two non-funded places can be allocated to each school. This is on a first come-first-serve basis.

Eligibility for funded places can be found on our website, and any eligible student will have the cost of accommodation and food fully funded. Unfortunately, funding cannot be provided for travel costs to Cambridge.

Reading Scholars 2022/23 Year 12 Higher Education Experience

Well done to those of you who have already applied. Last chance today as closing date is this afternoon!!

The Reading Scholars programme aims to give Year 12 students a real taste of life as a university undergraduate, and provides practical support as participants begin their higher education application process. Comprising of 4 on-campus events (December, February, March and a residential in July) and featuring input from leading academics and current undergraduate mentors, the programme will challenge participants academically and enhance current studies. Activities include support from a current student mentor, university-style subject-specific and study skills sessions, and working towards an academic project

Costs:

All costs related to participation in the programme, including transport, lunch, refreshments and accommodation for on-campus events, are covered in advance for participating students, who will also get to take part in a range of fun team-building and social events.

Entry requirements:

Students participating in the programme will have achieved at least five GCSE's at grade 4 and above, and be on course to achieve good grades at A

Level or equivalent. The programme is targeted at students who fall into our priority groups (for example, young carers or family income of less than £25,000). Read our full selection criteria here.
