
These sessions are compulsory and aimed at supporting students to achieve their goals.

All costs including travel, accommodation, food and activities are covered by the Trust and our partners which means it is completely free of charge for students to attend.


What is the Apprenticeship Summer School programme?

Summer-in-Winter Chicken

A straightforward, one pan recipe for those of you already looking forward to summer and wanting to see the back of these cold January days.

Recipe from BBC Good Food.

Ingredients:

1 tablespoon of olive oil
4 Boneless skinless chicken breasts
200g pack cherry tomatoes
3 tablespoons of pesto
3 tablespoons of crème fraiche (half fat is fine)
Fresh basil leaves (optional)

a great dish for weekdays - to serve with rice, salad, pasta or potatoes ... you choose!

STEP 1: Heat the oil in a frying pan. Add the chicken and fry without moving it until it takes on a bit of colour. Turn the chicken and cook on the other side. Continue cooking for around 12-15 minutes until the chicken is cooked through. Season all over with a little salt and pepper.

STEP 2: Halve the tomatoes and throw them into the pan, stirring them around for a couple of minutes until they start to soften. Reduce the heat and stir in the pesto and crème fraiche until it makes a sauce. Scatter with a few basil leaves if you have them.

STEP 3: Serve with rice and salad or mash and broccoli or serve with tagliatelle pasta if you prefer.

To make a vegetarian option:

Fry the tomatoes in the oil, add the pesto and crème fraiche and serve over griddled halloumi slices or spoon over some spinach and ricotta-stuffed ravioli.
