



Ride Along are available in these three departments:

Community Policing Team

The CPT is at the heart of the local police service and is generally considered the 'front line'.

From immediate calls for assistance to long term neighbourhood solutions the officers working from our CPT hubs are at the forefront of the service. The teams are made up of Police Officers, Community Support Officers and Local Crime Investigators and together they form the local side of policing.

Communications Centre

If you're interested to see what life is like on the other side of a 999 or 101 call, why not join a two-hour tour of the Crime and Communications Centre?

Every day the CCC deals with on average over 1000 calls a day. These vary from general calls for help to calls involving life and death situations. See how officers are deployed to scenes and how we call on specialist resources when required. This department is where key decisions are made that set out how we respond to all our calls for service.

Wiltshire Police Dog Section

Come and visit Wiltshire Police HQ at Devizes where our police dogs are trained.

Due to the nature of Police Dog work, it will not be possible for you to 'ride along' with an active patrol unit. However, we do encourage those who may be particularly interested in the work of the Dog Section to attend HQ in Devizes during a training day as an observer. Training is undertaken on a regular basis, and you will be offered an appropriate time and date for your experience. The timescales of the visit will vary according to the type of training being undertaken on the day.



Ask Bath

Offering students in Years 10-13 short-term academic support and information about university applications and student life from a current student E-Mentor.

What is Ask Bath?

Ask Bath is an online chat service for students in Years 10-13 from widening participation backgrounds. Ask Bath offers academic peer support, information about university applications and insight into life at university. It offers instant messaging for students via a secure platform enabling them to link up with an E-Mentor whenever and where ever they want, for as short or long a time as they like. To be eligible to join the programme students will need to meet one or more of our <u>Widening Participation criteria</u>.





How does it work?

Our E-Mentors can give Ask Bath students some short-term academic support in many different subjects that they have studied themselves, as well as providing information and guidance about university, the applications process and student life.

- Students will choose their own E-Mentor based on the subject that they need help with or to ask about university life.
- The E-Mentor will guide the student with questions about homework, the relevant academic subject or with information about university applications and what it's like to study at university.
- If the student would like help with a different academic subject, they can request to be unmatched and then get help from an E-Mentor in the different subject.
- The match with an E-Mentor is a short-term arrangement (up to 6-8 weeks during which students work with their E-Mentor on their chosen mentoring goals). Mentoring matches will expire after a short period of inactivity.

Halloween Pumpkin Cupcakes

As we are not far off Halloween, here are some tasty Pumpkin flavoured Cup Cakes to try out.

You may event want to enter them in the Bake Off Competition on 31 October!



Ingredients

200g self-raising flour

1 tsp cinnamon

1/2 tsp of ground ginger

1/2 tsp of nutmeg

1/2 tsp allspice

1 tsp baking powder

¼ tsp bicarbonate of soda

Pinch of salt



300 g caster sugar

nl 170g pureed pumpkin

2 large eggs

125 ml of vegetable oil

2 tablespoons of maple syrup

For Frosting & Decoration:

60g softened butter

60g cream cheese softened.

240g icing sugar, sifted.


1 tsp vanilla extract

Green and orange food colouring

Pretzel sticks to use as stalks.

Method:

- 1. Heat the oven to 180C (160C fan, Gas4). Line a 12-hole muffin tin with cupcake cases.
- Sift the Flour with the ginger, nutmeg, allspice, baking powder, bicarbonate of soda &
- In a separate bowl, mix the sugar, pumpkin, eggs, oil and maple syrup and evenly combine
- 4. Gently fold the wet ingredients into the flour mixture.
- Spoon the mixture into the cupcake cases, filling them around three quarters full. Bake for 18 Minutes or until a cocktail stick inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. Leave to cool on a wire rack.
- For Frosting, cream the butter and cream cheese until smooth, gradually add the icing sugar and continue to cream until light and fluffy. Mix in the vanilla extract.
- Place a scoup of the frosting into a separate bowl and colour with green food colouring.
- Colour the remainder orange. Spread a layer onto each cup cake. Then using a piping bag to pipe a pumpkin design around each cupcake.
- Use the green to pipe the pumpkin leaves and finish with a pretzel stick as the stalk if desired.

Unlock Cyber Careers Event - Wiltshire

This is a new event for Key Stage 4 and 5 students (Years 11,12,13) which provides a fantastic opportunity to meet employers and learn about careers in cyber security. It is being launched in October as part of National Cybersecurity Awareness Month.

It will be of particular interest to those students studying Computer Science and STEM subjects, who enjoy problem solving and analysing information.

It is a half-day event taking place on Wednesday 11 October from 12.30pm – 4.30pm at the Swindon and Wiltshire Institute of Technology in Swindon.
