On your **exam day**

This checklist will help you to be as prepared as possible for your exams, so that on the day itself you can focus on doing your best.

Before sitting your exams, ensure you know: the date, time and location of your exams - you might find it helpful to write this information in a calendar or planner who to contact at school or college in case there's an emergency that makes you late or unable to sit your exam	What you cannot take into exams: any type of phone revision notes any type of watch (this includes analogue, digital and smart watches)
What you will need: a clear pencil case at least two black ink pens - blue pens are not acceptable an approved calculator for relevant exams appropriate apparatus such as a ruler or protractor for relevant exams a clear water bottle if you wish to take one in - it must not have a label	Other important information: Listen carefully to the invigilator's instructions which will be specific to your exam. If you are unsure of anything, please raise your hand and wait for the invigilator. Fill in your details on the front of your answer booklet. If you need additional answer sheets, raise your hand and wait for an invigilator who will provide you with one. Remember to add your details to this booklet too. If you need to use the toilet or feel unwell, raise your hand and wait for an invigilator who will escort you from the exam room.
Contingency sessions: There are contingency sessions within the Summer 2024 exam timetable - the afternoon of 6 June and 13 June 2024 and the morning and afternoon of 26 June 2024. Make sure you are available on all three dates even if you do not have an exam.	Make sure you stay silent – talking to a fellow candidate could result in disqualification from all your exams. If you have any questions about your exams, please ask your teacher or exams officer.









Applications for your Year 12 students to apply for LSE Springboard are now open!

Do you work with high achieving students currently planning their next steps after A-Levels? The London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) are offering your pupils the chance to take part in the Springboard programme which gives students a taste of university-level teaching and learning.

This is a **fantastic opportunity for students** to gain the support they need to apply to LSE and other high-tariff universities.

The fully funded 10-month hybrid programme kicks off in January and includes:

- An online academic programme delivered by PhD tutors in partnership with The Brilliant Club
- Multiple campus visits to LSE, including an end of programme celebration
- Virtual information sessions on applying to university, student finance and budgeting and personal statements
- Guidance sessions on how to think about careers, revision skills and mental wellbeing



Deadline: Sunday 26th November.





The Gresham Schools Oracy Competition Enter by 8 December 2023*

Gresham College is back for the second year, launching the Schools Oracy Competition in October 2023. For state schools and sixth form students only, it's aimed at Year 12 students. **The competition promotes the art of communicating complex information in a clear, concise and compelling way.** This year's topics include music, law, Al and science amongst others.

The Competition will:

- support the development of oracy skills,
- help students with UCAS applications and job interviews,
- promote a deeper understanding of their chosen topic,
- introduce students to the inspiring research of world-class academics, and
- be an opportunity to present in front of academics and professionals.

How to Enter

Choose one of the following topics and please make a reasoned argument:

1. How can the law aid in creating a more equal, diverse and inclusive society?

Students should submit a recorded video presentation of no more than 5 minutes – the main focus should be the student speaking but you can use images, graphs, slides or other visual props that help explain your points. Shortlisted candidates will then be invited to present again in person in London, and there will be three awards (including prizes for student and the school).

To enter the competition, you need to fill out your details and a short summary citing your sources on our entry form, and by uploading the video file to the corresponding folder (ie if you are presenting on question 1, upload to Q1, if you're presenting on question 2, upload to Q2 etc.).

There are some guidance and resources on <u>our website</u> to help students explain complex issues in a clear, concise, logical and engaging way.

Why Enter?

Benefits for Students:

- 1. Participating in the Gresham Schools Oracy Competition will help students develop oracy and presentation skills useful for interviews and public speaking opportunities; it will also enhance CVs and UCAS applications.
- 2. The first place winner will receive £9,250 towards their first year of university tuition and £1,000 towards a laptop, the second place winner will receive £800 towards the purchase of a laptop,

and the third place winner will receive £600 towards the same.

3. Other benefits including mentoring opportunities.

Benefits for Schools:

Schools of the winners will receive £1,000 for the first place winner, and £500 for the second and third place winners to go towards enhancing the school or college's curriculum activities.

Key Dates

16 October 2023: Competition opens 8 December 2023: Competition closes

Early new year: Entrants notified

26 March 2024: In-person presentation at Gresham College (we will

cover travel expenses)

Each finalist will have five minutes to present and five minutes for Q&A with the panel.

Three Gresham medals will be awarded (Bronze, Silver and Gold).

What are the rules for entering?

- 1. Presentations must be **no longer than 5 minutes** if you submit a video that is longer than 5 minutes **your entry will be disqualified.**
- 2. When you start your presentation, please state your name, your school and which question you are answering.
- 3. You must submit a six point summary of your presentation with up to six sources.
- 4. Act as though you are presenting to a live audience at Gresham College.
- 5. Don't sit and read from your notes throughout your presentation.

6. If shortlisted, you will perform the same presentation as the one you originally entered.

Please note this competition is for state school or sixth form college students only.
