

Top Tips from the AA

How to drive safely in snow and ice

The roads can be dangerous in winter when there's snow, ice or sleet. Our top tip is to take it slow. **Stopping distances** can be 10 times longer when it's icy. Gentle manoeuvres and slow speeds are the key to safe **driving in ice and snow**.

1	Allow extra time for winter journeys
2	Plan routes around major roads, which are more likely to be cleared
	and gritted
3	Give yourself time to de-ice the car before you drive off
4	Wear comfortable dry shoes for driving so your feedt don't slip on the
	pedals
5	Check fuel levels, have at least a quarter of a tank in case of
	unexpected delays
6	Clear all windows using a scraper and de-icer and wait until the
	windscreen's fully demisted
7	Check and Replace worn or damaged wiper blades.
8	Don't leave your wipers on auto when you park up if there's a risk of
	frost. If the blades freeze to the screen, you could damage the blades
	or wiper motor when you turn the ignition on.
9	Make sure you screen bottle is topped up - use a suitable additive in
	your screenwash to reduce the chance of it freezing.

10	Make sure all car lights are working and the lenses are clean. You
	must use headlights when visibility is seriously reduced. If you use fog
	lights, remember to switch them off when visibility improves so they
	don't dazzle other drivers or obscure your brake lights.
11	Keep number plates clean, to avoid fines.
12	Keep essentials in your car in case of breakdown. These will help you deal with ice, snow and dark winter nights.

SPRING TERM AT GRESHAM COLLEGE

Medicine and Biology

This term sees the start of two new series: **New Hope in Cancer**, and **Neurodiversity** - featuring practitioners at the cutting-edge of these fields. Meanwhile, Gresham Professor and CMO Chris Whitty gives two further talks on Medicine After Disasters, while Professor Robin May continues to look into Evolution: The Big Questions.

Music

Gresham Professor Milton Mermikides continues to explore the universal building blocks of music including prediction, rhythm, pitch, scale, dissonance and

multiplicity, in his series The Nature of Music. Visiting Professor of Film and Theatre Music, Dominic Broomfield-McHugh, shines a light on Shirley Bassey.

Climate Change & the Environment

Post COP28, Gresham Professor Myles Allen, the physicist behind net zero, continues his analysis on what it will take to limit global warming to just 1.5° C, and Professor Mudway examines Lead: A Toxic Legacy.

Maths and Astronomy

Gresham Professor Sarah Hart kicks off her 2024 lectures with a look at Mathematical Puzzles and Paradoxes in her continuing exploration of games, puzzles, riddles, seemingly inexplicable coincidences, confounding conundrums, and mathematical sleight-of-hand. Gresham Professor Chris Linott, also of Cambridge University and the BBC's Sky at Night, presents his next two lectures on Discovering the Universe.

History, Law and the Humanities

Gresham Professor of Rhetoric Melissa Lane joins us from Princeton University, to continue her lectures on Ancient Greek Ideas and their relevance today, beginning with a look at the concept of Justice. Professor Leslie Thomas KC examines the state of LGBT Legal Rights, with particular reference to the Commonwealth Caribbean, and we begin our new series on Migration and Refugeehood.

Information Technology

Gresham Professor of IT, Victoria Baines, continues delivering her Tech Change Survival Guide with a lecture on Sex and the Internet.

We suggest you make the most of the word count to explain and reflect on why you have chosen the subject area and the University of Southampton. In order to provide us with a clear picture of you as an applicant.



What is UNIQ?

UNIQ is the University of Oxford's access programme for UK state school students. We prioritise places for students with good grades from backgrounds that are under-represented at Oxford and other universities. Every year more students from diverse backgrounds get offered places at Oxford with help from UNIQ.

The UNIQ residential summer school started in 2010 and we continually make changes to improve the support we provide to UNIQ students. Owing to the pandemic, UNIQ was delivered entirely online for 2 years before the residential component returned in 2022. Since then, UNIQ has been a hybrid programme, offering students both an academic residential in Oxford and a sustained online admissions support programme.

Here are the top things you need to know about UNIQ:

- UNIQ offers both an in-person residential in Oxford and an online support programme.
- UNIQ starts online in April, with academic courses in the summer, followed by further online admissions support until December.
- UNIQ is a free programme and applications close in January.
- Applying to UNIQ via our website is very simple and takes about 15 minutes.
- UNIQ gives students the opportunity to find out if Oxford is right for them.
- Many UNIQ students get the opportunity to stay in an Oxford college and explore Oxford for themselves.
- UNIQ helps students prepare for university and explore subjects that interest them.

- UNIQ students get to know our Oxford undergraduates and work with our academics in face-to-face lectures, labs and tutorials.
- UNIQ enables students with similar interests in local regions and across the UK to connect with each other through social and academic activities.
- There are over 1000 places on the UNIQ academic summer residential.
- Information about the admissions process is available throughout the programme, and, for those who decide to apply to Oxford, there is more intensive support available in the autumn to help with preparation for our admissions tests and interviews.
- UNIQ is open to students attending UK state schools and selection considers students' school grades and their socio-economic and educational background.
- UNIQ students who apply to Oxford have a higher rate of success than other students.

What is the new Access Apprenticeships programme?

Over a year, we will be offering students the opportunity to learn more about one of three different apprenticeship sectors: **Banking and Finance** (London based), **Engineering** (Birmingham based), **and Law** (London based). They will need to live within commutable distance of the programme they are applying for.

At the end of the programme, students will walk away with:

A work experience placement at one of our partner organisation.

An in depth understanding of apprenticeships and whether it could be the right route for them.

Networking opportunities for future career opportunities.

Access to our online portal for ongoing application support and career advice.

A personal application mentor, including learning where to find current apprenticeships and understanding different application processes.

How to apply?

To apply for either programme, students should:

- Attend, and have always attended, a state-funded, non-fee-paying school/college
- Currently be in Year 12
- We prioritise students based on a range of social mobility criteria including eligibility for free school meals, and the context of their school and neighbourhood.

Both programme applications close on March 7th at midday. We are unable to accept any late submissions.
