Are you starting university this year?

Wiltshire Community Foundation offers grants to young people in Wiltshire and Swindon who need support with the costs of studying an undergraduate degree at university. The One Degree More bursary is £1,600 for each year of the course to help with general living expenses, course costs, books and equipment. We are now open for applications for those stating university this year.

Who is eligible to apply – young people can apply for a university bursary if they:

- are under 24 years old
- have lived in Wiltshire or Swindon for at least 2 years
- parents or guardians receive 2 means-tested benefits (2 elements of Universal Credit)
- eligible for funding through Student Finance England
- studying for first undergraduate degree at a UK university or college
 Or
- are a young person in the care of Wiltshire or Swindon Borough Council (LAC)







A great opportunity for high-achieving students with The University of Hull Chancellor's Scholarship

The Chancellor's Scholarship will reward 10 high-achieving students who have a great potential for academic excellence.

It will cover the full cost of their undergraduate tuition fees and will be awarded to 10 new University of Hull students per year, starting with 2024/25 entry and will run for three years.

Key Criteria:

- Applicants must be UK resident and qualify for Home fee status.
- All undergraduate degree courses commencing Autumn 2024 are eligible with the exceptions of Foundation courses and Medicine.
- Applicants will need to submit a written application (max 500 words) and a video (max 2 minutes) explaining why they should be considered.
- A predicted grade of at least 128 UCAS points.
- Applications will be assessed on multiple criteria rather than just grades alone. This includes a student's passion for their chosen subject, their overall communication skills and their plans to contribute to university life.






