We're all busy and we all wish we could have more time, but, unfortunately, there's only so many hours in the day. This is especially true of students who are preparing to sit their end-of-year exams.

Here are three super-quick hacks that you might want to use to help make revision sessions and exam preparation more effective:

• The 2-Minute Rule: The 2-minute rule is very simple – if a task can be achieved in 2 minutes or less, just do it. The longer you put it off, the more opportunity it must morph into a much larger task, or you risk forgetting to do it altogether.



• **Eat the Frog:** While it might not conjure up the nicest imagery, eating your frog is actually one of the most effective ways to prioritise your workload. It simply means to get your most difficult or daunting task out of the way first before you move on to something else.



• **No Notifications:** Your phone is a fantastic source of communication, entertainment, and knowledge, but it comes with a pretty hefty price – your attention. By limiting notifications, you will find yourself able to get much more (and higher quality) work done throughout the day.

The FCDO's Next Generation Economics Competition is LIVE!

We would like to invite you and your school to participate in this year's competition. We have a choice of 4 essay questions focusing on topics right at the heart of the work of FCDO economists: the gender pay gap, carbon emissions, food security and debt.

What is the purpose of the competition?

Economics has a diversity problem: only 1 in every 17 girls takes economics at A-level compared to 1 in 6 boys, and despite significant progress in ethnic diversity, black economists remain under-represented at UK universities. Socioeconomic background also affects who studies economics; only 1 in 12 students at state schools study A-level economics compared to 1 in 5 students at independent schools.

With this in mind, the FCDO has collaborated with LSE to create a competition which invites UK school students to write to the FCDO Chief Economist about the biggest economic challenges facing their generation, and has two main aims:

- **Inspire** the next generation of economists.
- **Increase diversity** in the economics profession, enabling better policymaking.

Who can apply?

- Any student aged 14-18 studying at a school in the UK or International British School.
- You do not have to be studying economics or have any prior knowledge of economics.

Still need convincing.

There are multiple prizes on offer:

- The winner will receive a cash prize of £500
- 2 runners up will each receive £250.
- 5 remaining shortlisted entries will receive £100
- The top 25 entrants will each receive an economics book.

• The top 8 entrants will have the opportunity of a fully funded visit to the FCDO and London School of Economics in London, where they will meet with the FCDO Chief Economist, Adnan Khan.

How do I enter?

- We will be accepting entries from **26 February 2024 until 28 June 2024**, and more information can be found on our webpage here.
- We have a team of passionate economists that would be happy to talk to your staff and students and answer any questions on the competition, the FCDO or the work that we do.

SIXTH FORM READING MENTORS

Sixth Form students have been supporting Y7 and Y8 pupils with their reading once a week during iLearn since September.

Over eighty Y12 and Y13 students responded to a request to receive training to help the younger students improve their reading skills. The Sixth Formers undertook training which included recalling their own experiences in learning to read, tips on how to listen and support younger students and checking whether the reader understands what they have just read aloud.

The atmosphere in the Sixth Form is very calm and it is rewarding seeing the older students being encouraging and patient with the younger students. Y7 and Y8 students are becoming much more confident, and the Sixth Formers are great role models. They are developing important mentoring and training skills which they will be able to take with them to Higher Education and employment.

I believe it has helped me with my confidence and fluency'.

I enjoy reading more and I find it easier to choose books.





Traditional Easter Biscuits

Lighly spiced easy Biscuits and deliciously buttery. Make lots as they will not last long!



Ingredients:

100g butter (room temperature)

90 g caster sugar

200g plain flour

1/2 teaspoon of mixed spice

1/2 teaspoon of ground nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon of lemon juice and grated zest (optional)

1 large egg yolk

75 g currants

Topping - 1 egg white and caster sugar

Preparation: Set the Oven to 180C/160C fan/Gas 4/350F

Grease baking trays or use baking paper.

Grate the lemon rind and juice half a lemon.

Method:

- Put all the ingredients for the biscuits, apart from the currants into the mixer or processor and mix well to combine.
 - (If making by hand beat the butter and sugar together until creamy, add the egg yolk and lemon juice and zest and beat in then mix in flour and spice together. Stir in the currants, squeeze together to form a dough)
- Scrape the down the sides and mix again, so that you have a ball of dough of a soft consistency. Add the currents and mix in by hand.
- 3. Gather the dough and place on a lightly floured surface to roll.
- Roll out the dough to about ½ cm thick and cut our rounds gather up the dough and re-roll, it is quite resilient so doesn't mind a few rolling out.
- Bake for about 10 12 minutes.
- Remove from the oven and brush each biscuit, very lightly with the lightly beaten egg white. Sprinkle with a little caster sugar and return to the oven for 4-5 minutes or until pale golden brown.
- For the best results do one biscuit at a time egg white then sugar.
- Cool on the baking tray for 5-10 minutes then lift onto a cooling rack to completely cool.

TIP: They will keep in an airtight container for 1-2 weeks.
